MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. First Reading - I have lifted high the lowly tree.

Second Reading - Whether we are at home or away, we aspire to please the Lord.

Gospel - It is the smallest of all seeds, and becomes the largest of plants.

SOW THE SEED

Mustard. What does the word bring to your mind? Probably a thick, yellow, spicy sauce in a jar. In today's Gospel Jesus talks about another kind of mustard. This black mustard plant was not cultivated in Jesus' time and was considered a weed. Like all varieties of mustard, the black mustard plant grows from a very tiny seed, no bigger than two millimeters in diameter. Yet, given the right conditions, it can grow up to nine feet tall—certainly tall enough for birds to perch and nest in. Jesus says that the reign of God is like the mustard plant. It starts with the tiniest of seeds in the ground. Sun and rain do their work and a large plant shoots up, almost as big as a tree! So it is with our discipleship and our stewardship. If we start in even the smallest way to trust in God, that leads to more commitment in our discipleship. We nurture our spiritual growth through prayer, the sacraments, Bible study, and adult classes, which leads to a stronger faith. That in turn helps us to live less fearfully and selfishly. The use of our spare time, personal skills and abilities, and financial resources takes on a different meaning. These are the fruits of our discipleship to share with others. Time and time again, those among us who have made their commitment to a more faithful discipleship tell us they become more generous stewards of what God has given them. The more they give the more they want to give. They have found that when you cease to holding on tightly to yourself and your possessions, more blessings come your way—not solutions to all problems or sudden riches, but a much deeper sense of God's presence and true peace of heart.

Urge NJ Assembly to Oppose Assisted Suicide Bill

The Assembly Judiciary Committee released the Aid in Dying for the Terminally Ill Act (A1504). The bill will now be voted on by the General Assembly. The bill would allow physicians to prescribe drugs to end the lives of terminally ill individuals considered to have six months to live. The facts are clear - in California, in Vermont and in Oregon - states that have passed assisted suicide bills - insurance companies have denied individuals expensive healthcare coverage but offered them low cost drugs to end their life.

In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as a financial liability for the insurance company, and decisions to encourage death could be driven by reducing costs.


What Makes a Dad
