
PARISH OFFICE HOURS: Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon **BAPTISMS:** Every third Sunday of the month at 12:00. Parents are expected to attend Pre-Baptismal Classes. Arrangements to be made at the Parish Office. **Only practicing Catholics may act as Godparents.**

MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. Please call or stop by the Parish office to complete a registration form. We should also be notified if your address has changed or if you are leaving the parish.

April 21, 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

"I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me."

First Reading: : Acts 4:8-12

Peter explains to the elders that his healing of a cripple was done in the name of Jesus Christ. He reminds he elders that they crucified Jesus, but God rose him up so that all people could be saved in his name.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-2

John expresses amazement at the fact that God allowed us to be called his children. Although we are unsure exactly what we will be after this life, we do know that we will see God as he is and be like him.

Gospel: John 10:11-18

Jesus speaks of a shepherd working only for pay, with no real concern for the sheep being well cared for. But Jesus is our shepherd and would lay down his own life for all those in his flock. God loves him for his willingness to sacrifice himself for the sake of all God's children.

GOSPEL REFECTION

We are familiar with the image: Jesus, staff in hand, carrying a lamb across his shoulders. It's a beautiful image but it doesn't reflect the reality of shepherding as hard and sometimes risky work. In the passage prior to today's Gospel Jesus has healed a blind man on the Sabbath day and the Pharisees say he has broken the law, which forbids all work on the Lord's day-even healing! Jesus says that, as the Good Shepherd, he is not like hired hands who collect pay for watching the sheep, but abandon them in time of need.

Jewish scriptures frequently describe God as a shepherd. Such imagery was also used by Moses and the prophets as well as the psalmists: "Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel,/you who lead Joseph like a flock!" (Psalm 80:1) and "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want" (Psalm 23:1). So the Pharisees know exactly what Jesus means: not only is he prepared to break the Sabbath law, but he is claiming to be God, an outrage in their eyes. They also know he is contrasting himself with them-the hired hands entrusted with the care of God's people, but caring more for rules they had lost sight of the living heart of Judaism (see Deuteronomy 10:12-20 and Micah 6:8). In addition, they lacked humility and judged as unworthy those who followed the rules less devotedly. Any time we say others as less worthy, less obedient, less devout than we are, trouble follows. Let's keep our eyes on the Shepherd and follow him.

World Day of Prayer for Vocations!

God our Father, You made each of us to use our gifts in the Body of Christ. We ask that You inspire young people whom you call to the priesthood and consecrated life to courageously follow Your will. Send workers into Your great harvest so that the Gospel is preached, the poor are served with love, the suffering are comforted, and Your people are strengthened by the sacraments. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen
