Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. May 5, 2024 SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him."

First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Peter preaches to the Gentiles for the first time in the house of Cornelius. Peter realized that God would accept any person who acted uprightly, regardless of his or her heritage. Then the Holy Spirit descended on the Gentiles and Peter allowed them to be baptized in the name of Jesus.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-10

John advises all believers to love one another, for love is a gift from God. The person without love does not know God, whose love for us is so great he sent his only son so that we might have life through him.

Gospel: John 15:9-17

Jesus asks his disciples to live on in his love and to "Love one another as I have loved you." He explains that he chose them to follow him, and promises if they keep his commandments they will have anything that they ask for in his name.

GOSPEL REFECTION

As a nation, we are mobile people. We travel around during vacations, special events, visiting families and friends. We readily move from one place to another for school, college, work, health reasons and finally retirement. While previous generations usually stayed with one job and in one house all their lives, today it is common to move from one place to another, to a different state or even to a different country. This mobility carries us over into our relationships. We find that our lives take us from one set of friends to another, from one close relationship to another. So, Jesus' admonition to remain in his love can sound challenging for most of us whose lives are characterized by change and impermanence. The word "remain" is sometimes translated as "abide." The meaning of Jesus' invitation to us is to "take up permanent residence."

Last week Jesus called us to "remain" in his word; this week, to "remain in his love" (John 15:9). Jesus tells us how to do this by keeping his commandments. So, that his joy might be in us and our joy complete. He asks us to love one another as I have loved you. He loved us so much he lay down his life for us. By remaining in his love our on going friendship with him bears fruit and gains whatever we ask the Father in his name.
