The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. May 12, 2024 SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Go and teach all nations, says the Lord; I am with you always, until the end of the world."

First Reading: Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26

The disciples decided that someone should take the place of Judas, who killed himself in remorse for betraying Jesus. They nominated two who had been among them from the time of Jesus' baptism to the crucifixion. Then they drew lots to decide who would join them as witnesses of the resurrection.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:11-16

John reminds us that God dwells in those who love one another. We have come to know God's love for us. Only by loving one another can we be sure that God will remain with us always.

Gospel: John 17:11b-19

Jesus prays for his disciples at the Last Supper. He know that by knowing the word of God as they do, they no longer belong to the world. He asks that God consecrate them in truth and protect them from the enemies they have made because of their belief in Jesus.

GOSPEL REFECTION

Both Matthias and Barnabas were artists so, St. Peter decided on a contest. He divided the upper room where the community gathered for worship with a curtain, giving half to each one to decorate. The community would declare the winner as Judas' successor. All week long both Barnabas and Matthias toiled all week behind their curtain. People could hear only humming and soft singing. The day came and the people entered Barnabas' half of the church and applauded his artistry. The uses of color were magnificent. They found themselves depicted in his paintings and they were delighted. Peter became worried. How could Matthias' work possibly compete with Barnabas? He went to the curtain and turned it back. Silence filled the room as people turned to see what Matthias had done. His work had been to polish the stone walls of the chapel's other half, allowing people to see themselves as never before. The walls shone like mirrors and every person was given a sense of the beauty of Christ shining within them, a glimpse of the divine spark each one carried within. So, Matthias was chosen to replace Judas. He had revealed Christ by revealing Christ's followers to themselves.
