

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"So out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name." (GENESIS 2:19)

The creation story reminds us of two important points. First, since the start, God has put the entire world into our care. Second, stewardship has been around since the beginning of mankind, it isn't something recently invented by the Church. Just as past generations built our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue to nurture and develop these gifts for future generations.

Reflecting on God's Word

The basis of Jewish law says Jesus, is that all human beings are created equal in the image of God. The disciples attempt to keep some children and their parents from disturbing Jesus, probably thinking that women and children were not important enough to disturb the Master! Jesus is indignant. Gathering the children, he says self-important people should imitate them. Young children usually accept the rules of life without quibbling over details. They accept the love of parents and trust that rules are for their well-being, even if they do not fully understand them. A loving Father offers us the gift of faith. Jesus is asking us to be child-like, not childish, accepting this gift with simplicity and trust. Discussing faith is fine, but we cannot stop there. Since we do not earn faith—it is freely given to us—we are called to express this faith in how we live our lives. We are equal in God's sight and equally responsible to live up to our calling.

As we begin the month of October, we enter a special period of reflection and action for our Church's missionary efforts worldwide. World Mission Sunday, which will be celebrated on October 20th, is a vital time for all Catholics to support the spread of the Gospel in mission territories.
