Let us make ready the way of the Lord by abounding in love and in works of justice.

First Reading: Baruch 5:1-9

Baruch tells Jerusalem to rejoice because of God's plan to bring his exiled people back to Jerusalem. He emphasizes God's power and describes his plan to lower mountains and fill gorges to make their journey easier.

<u>Second Reading</u>: Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11

Paul encourages the Philippians to love each other completely. He hopes that their love and understanding will continue to grow so that they are prepared for the return of Christ.

Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

Luke describes the work John the Baptist carried out to help people prepare for the birth of Jesus. Luke also discusses who was in power at the time, which helped historians to figure out the exact dates of certain events, including Jesus' birth.

Reflecting on God's Word

Since late October, the students in the college residence in which I live have been eagerly and insistently listening to Christmas music. It began with occasional songs on the piano. A week later one of them came upon an old turntable and some Sinatra Christmas LPs. After they returned from Thanksgiving vacation, Christmas music played all day long. As a result, I've found myself wondering what it is that's driven these twenty-year olds toward such early visions of Christmas sugarplums.

I've come to believe that beneath all the glitter draped and swagger with ribbons and bows, over these days, deeper longings are at play, beyond the desire for the latest iphone, longings for community or healed relationships, longings too for peace among nations and for some sort of equality among people.

Curiously, such deepened longings are never marketed by any hype. Yet like Christmas spirit, they just seem to sprout wherever the human spirit finds a niche. I suppose one could make the observation that a twenty-year-old's longing for Christmas is little more than leftover nostalgia for childhood Santas and once-upon-a-time daydreams. Maybe so. Paul once wrote to the Philippian community that such urgings all begin wth God and that ultimately "the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus "

(Philippians 1:6). In other words, these deeper longings, they seem to be God's doing, and where are we to put them on a timetable?


Holiday Support Group for Adult Children of Divorce
