The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. Pope's Universal Intention for December 2024

We pray that this Jubilee Year strengthen our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in our daily lives, and that it may transform us into pilgrims of Christian hope.

First Reading: Zephaniah 3:14-18a

Zephaniah urges the people of Jerusalem to rejoice because the Lord is in their midst. He conveys the message that God will love and protect those who have remained faithful to him.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:4-7

Paul encourages the Philippians to be ready for Christ. He tells them not to worry about their concerns, but to instead ask God's help and allow his peace to fill their hearts and minds.

Gospel: Luke 3:10-18

John the Baptist answers people who ask him what they should do, leading some to believe he was the Messiah. John clearly states that he will be followed by one so powerful that "I am not fit to loosen his sandal strap."

An Advent Examination

Advent is the perfect time to clear and prepare the Way.

It is a winter training camp for those who desire peace. By reflection and prayer, by reading and meditation, we can make our hearts a place where a blessing of peace would desire to abide and where the birth of the Prince of Peace would take place.

We can make a daily Advent examination—? Is there a lingering resentment, an unforgiven injury living in our hearts? Do we look down upon others of lesser social standing or educational achievement? Are we generous with the gifts that have been given to us?

These and other questions become Advent lights by which we may search the deep, dark corners of our hearts.

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." (PHILIPPIANS 4:6)

St. Paul reminds us that God is an abundant God – He is the ultimate giver of gifts. He promises to give us all that we need. Remember, that we are created in God's image and likeness. We, too, are made to be generous with all of our gifts as well. Placing our trust in God frees us from being a slave to possessions. It allows us to gratefully and generously share ourselves and our goods with others.



5 steps to making a Good Confession



- 1. Examination of Conscience Know your sins.
- 2. Contrition- Be sorry for your sins
- 3. Decide not to sin again.
- 4. Confess your sins to a priest.
- 5. Penance Do the penance the priest gives you.

The Effects of a Good Confession

*It is an exercise in Christian Humility:

-Genuine self-knowledge grows

-Bad habits are corrected

*Spiritual neglect and tepidity are resisted

-Sins are forgiven

-Conscience is purified

*Souls are washed clean in the Blood of Christ

-The will is strengthened

*Sacramental grace is received to resist sins and temptations exposed in the sacrament

-A healthy self-control is attained

*Grace increases in the soul because of the reception of the Sacrament

-Temporal punishment in purgatory is reduced with every good/worthy

These are the effects and graces we receive with the reception of the Sacrament of Penance.


