The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

Pope's Universal Intention for February 2025

For vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Let us pray that the ecclesial community might welcome the desires and doubts of those young people who feel a call to serve Christ's mission in the priesthood and religious life.

5TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME FEBRUARY 9, 2025

"Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." Luke 5:9-11

First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Isaiah recounts the awe he felt the first time he saw the Lord, who was surrounded by angels. He began to feel despair because he was a man of unclean lips, until an angel touched an ember to his lips and pronounced them clean. The Lord asked who he should send forth, to which Isaiah replied, "Here I am. send me!"

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Paul reminds the Corinthians that Christ died for us to free us from our sins. He encourages them to remember the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection. He admits that he initially failed to believe, and therefore was very grateful to be called an apostle and preach in the name of Christ.

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Luke tells of Jesus preaching to a crowd, then joining Peter who was about to end a fruitless day of fishing. He told Peter to lower his net back in, and a great number of fish were caught. Upon seeing this, Peter and his companions, James and John, immediately abandoned their nets to follow Jesus.

OUR LADY of LOURDES Feast Day February 11

Yearly, over 2 million people journey to southeastern France to Lourdes, seeking cures, answers, believing, and praying.

On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous, followed by 17 visits, many with 20,000 people present. When Bernadette asked the Lady's identity, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Just four years earlier, the pope had proclaimed it a dogma that Mary was conceived immaculate without original sin. The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart. Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She directed Bernadette to tell the priests that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held.

On February 25, 1858, Our Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. After several attempts, she found the water and drank. The water continued to flow from that spot until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day—as it still does. Over 5,000 cures have been recorded, but less than 100 of them have been declared miraculous by the Church. Most have taken place during the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.


